# MESSAGE FROM HOUSE CONVENOR

The Club's Mission Statement declares: "Our Mission is to provide members with a quality customer service experience, well maintained facilities and enjoyable golfing, social and sports activities".

The Mission Statement clarifies what the Club wants to achieve and it is interesting to note that "well maintained facilities" is encapsulated right within. It is as if the ability of the Club to deliver quality customer service and offering members and guests with enjoyable golfing, social and sporting activities are both dependent upon it - that is having a range of facilities that is operationally functional and well kept.

Most people think of maintenance as fixing equipment that is broken and keeping facilities in working order. However, effective maintenance is not just about upholding the status quo but also about development, renewal and upgrading.

#### **Upkeep and Maintenance**

As the building ages, repair and maintenance works begin to increase in frequency and complexity. In order to minimise deterioration that takes its toll over time, every effort is taken to implement a robust preventative maintenance regime so as to prolong the useful lifespan of the building, its fixtures, fittings and equipment.

Whilst upkeep of the Club's facilities is largely handled by the staff team, as Club members and users, we should play our part by taking proper care of the facilities and its fixtures when using, so as not to subject them to undue damage or misuse other than the normal wear and tear. In this way, we can make our facilities more enduring for the benefits of all.

Effective communication flow is often cited as a factor that boost productivity. Hence, it is important that members proactively provide feedback or report defects found to the maintenance staff team and at the same time exercising patience to allow time for improvements or appropriate remedial solutions to be meted out.

## **Renewal and Upgrading**

Beyond optimising the lifespan of the Club's equipment and infrastructure, retro-fitting, or renewal is also required to alter or replace the building's existing fixtures and fittings beyond its initial condition. Such works are necessary in order to improve the amenities for the benefits and comfort of all members and to keep up with their changing needs and expectations.

At times, upgrading or replacement works are a sensible move to enable the building system to perform efficiently. Whilst cost savings are often advocated as an important part of staying within an available budget, investing in new and technologically advanced equipment could bring about a sustainable longer term savings. One such case in point is the replacement of aged air-conditioners with new units that utilise the inverter or variable refrigerant volume (VRV) technologies and another will be the re-lamping of conventional light bulbs with energy-efficient LED lighting solutions, both of which can reduce the Club's electricity bills substantially.

Traditionally, the broad thumb of rule in justifying the award of renovation and up-grading projects is to a contractor or supplier that offers the best, or cheaper in price. Whilst every effort is taken to adhere to this helpful guideline, a re-thinking of our evaluation process may at times, be necessary. Although cost will continue to receive serious consideration; we should also be mindful that any products purchased and works undertaken should be of an acceptable quality and durability so that it can last till the expiration of the Club's land lease.

#### **Past Accomplishments**

That being said, I am pleased to note that over the span of the past one and a half year, several projects had been accomplished. These include:

- Improvement to the surrounding pavement of Starter Hut with better slip resistant treatment.
- Replacement of the Club Corporate Sign at the Roof Tower with one that is durably fabricated out of polyurethane painted aluminum panel and original cut out vinyl decal.
- Replacement of roller blinds at Golfers' Terrace with track-guided "SMART" blinds equipped with rain sensors. The blinds came in hard-wearing fiberglass polyester fabric and were creatively installed without gaps between tracks and building columns. The planters at the terrace were also cleared out and replaced with realistic-looking artificial plants and decked with decorative coloured lights.
- Installed a sleekly designed reception counter at the golf bag drop off area complete with a directional signage to facilitate golfers locating it.
- Replacement of the conventional ceiling fans at Driving Range with oscillating ceiling fans which help to create better air flow and finally.
- We even spearheaded a move as part of the "Go Green" campaign to reduce the use of plastic bags, and encourage members to use the complimentary re-usable bags issued by the Club.

# 11TH WARREN - UNIFORCE AMATEUR OPEN 2022 13 - 15 July 2022

Some members may not know the inception of Warren Amateur Open and why it is an important tournament for the Club to organise every year. The objective of the event is to provide more exposure to local amateur players and also to answer to the call of Singapore Golf Association for local clubs to organise more of such events. Warren actually held its first Amaetur Open in 2008 and the participants had grown over the years. The Warren Amateur Open had since then be counted as a World Amateur Ranking event, a testimony to the growing stature of the tournament.

It had been three years since the Club hosted Warren Amateur Open. The 11th Warren-Uniforce Amateur Open 2022 had a field of more than 70 golfers comprising of local as well as overseas golfers from countries such as Indonesia, Thailand, India, Korea, China, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Australia, South Africa, Costa Rica, USA and Philipiness.

With challenging pin positions and greens speed throughout the three days, Malcolm Ting from Malaysia with a total aggregate gross score of 209 won the Overall Champion and our local National squad player, Inez Ng who played a total aggregate gross scores of 210 clinched the title for Ladies Division and Best Warren Amateur. Congratulations to both golfers!

The R&A Junior Open was founded in 1994 and came under The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews (R&A) 2000. It is held once every two years and all golfers around the world affiliated to the R&A are invited to enter their best under-16 boy and girl golfers. This event is closely linked to The Open Championship and is always played just before the Open, on a nearby course.

This year, Sean Pang (16 years old) and Chen Xingtong (14 years old) were selected to represent Singapore in this event, which was held at the Monifieth Golf Links in Angus, Scotland, from 10 to 13 July 2022. Both Sean and Xingtong are Warren's leading Junior golfers and we are proud of them for earning this opportunity.

It was the first time both of them experienced playing links golf and it is definitely a great experience to cherish. Links golf is a completely different style of golf to what is commonly found in Singapore. Besides the hard fairways that offer unpredictable bounces, the knee-height thick rough, strong wind and fast greens made for a challenging course set-up for the week. Additionally, the weather conditions were constantly changing, with temperatures fluctuating from a high of 25°C to a low of 15°C within the span of a few hours, and chilly wind reaching speed of up to 35km/h. All these factors provided a good test of the players' skills and ability to react and adapt to the tricky course conditions.

The opportunity to play and interact with top junior golfers from around the world and to play in a prestigious event like this is an honour that both Sean and Xingtong are grateful for. As Sean reflects, "It was an eye-opening experience for me, as I saw first-hand how my peers from other countries carried themselves and managed their way around the course. I was impressed by the diversity of the field, as well as the high standard of golf that was played at this event. I am extremely privileged to be given this experience, and I am excited to see how I use what I have learnt to elevate my game and shoot lower scores." On the other hand, Xingtong had quoted, "I have learnt a lot from this trip, having watched and played with many other talented golfers from different countries. I will be forever grateful to have the opportunity to participate in such a prestigious event and I look forward to applying the new skills which I have learnt in my daily routines and strategies."

# "Ask Our Trainer"

## What is protein?

Protein is a macronutrient that is essential for building muscle mass.

### Why do we need protein?

Amino acids are the monomers that make up proteins and they are required for many functions. Thus, it is important to ensure that our body has an adequate amount of proteins. Once broken down, proteins are constantly lost from the body. Hence, one should maintain a high protein diet on a daily basis. This is especially important for the growth of muscle and weight loss.

## How do I incorporate protein when I am seeking to lose weight?

People who are seeking to lose weight can try a low-carb and high-protein diet.

## How does protein helps us in our weight loss journey?

Eating protein suppresses our appetite. This is because calories from protein take longer time to digest than most carbohydrates and fats. As a result, eating high-quality proteins will make us feel satiated for a longer period.

### Why do we need to grow muscles?

Muscle burns more calories than fats to survive, those with more muscle tissues have a higher resting metabolic rate. A higher resting metabolic rate suggests that you burn more calories per day.

### Protein apparently weakens the kidneys. Is this true?

No. Kidneys eliminate unnecessary chemicals, metabolites and waste from the body. They are important in metabolising and removing the nitrogen by-products emitted from the digestion of protein. However, this does not imply that eating more protein will put a strain on a person's kidneys.

## There are also claims that protein weakens the bones. Is this true?

No. Increased protein intake increases insulin-like growth factor-1 level, calcium absorption and vitamin D level. All these effects contribute to bone strength.

### How much protein should I consume?

In general, for both men and women, the current daily protein intake recommended is 50 grams.

## Are there differences in the amount of protein to be consumed for athletic individuals?

More protein is required for persons who train such as athletes and sportsmen to develop muscle and aid in recuperation. 2 to 3 grams of protein per kilogram of bodyweight is generally a reasonable estimation for persons who are moderately to extremely active.

#### What are some great protein sources?

Animal proteins - chicken, red meat, eggs, fish and milk Plant proteins - rice, quinoa, beans, buckwheat and hempseed

## Are there any dangers to over-consumption of protein?

Some people are concerned that eating a high protein diet will harm their health. However, research shows that high protein diets are relatively safe for majority of healthy people and are not associated with serious side effects.
